Learn more about geographic information system (GIS) technology and geography during the 10th annual worldwide GIS Day™, Wednesday, November 19, 2008.

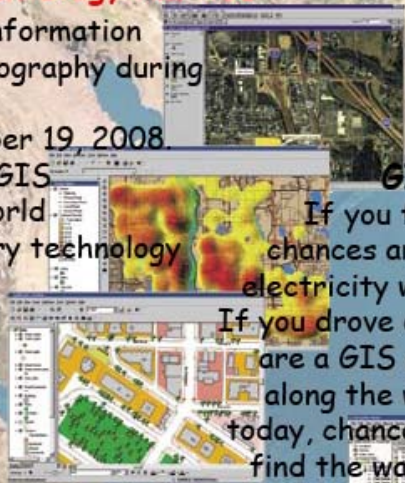
During GIS Day 2008, users of GIS technology will showcase real-world applications of this extraordinary technology through
